To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Samuel Estlin of Jackson County, Illinois, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Kaskaskia whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Samuel Estlin according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the South East quarter of Section Twenty-nine, in Township Nine, South of Range Two West, in the District of Lands offered for sale at Kaskaskia, Illinois, containing Eighty Acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Samuel Estlin

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Samuel Estlin and to his heirs — the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Samuel Estlin and to his heirs and assigns, forever.
